

GREEN CROSS PARK DEDICATION TODAY

With the planting of twenty trees from historic spots, American Green Cross Park No. 1 will be started today at the Royal Palms, or the sea end of Western avenue. The tree planting will be at 2 p.m., and honors National Conservation Day. Speakers will include Mayor Cryer, Dr. Samuel D. Barnes, head of the local Green Cross organization; Col. Willis G. Peace, commander at Fort MacArthur, Capt. R. P. Robson and Col. W. B. Greeley, chief United States Forester.

Among the trees to be planted are trees from Mount Vernon, Monticello the home of Gen. Grant at Mt. Pleasant, from Fort McHenry at Baltimore, where "The Star Spangled Banner" was written, and the battle fields of Brandywine and New Orleans.

The program of public addresses of the American Green Cross in observance of American Forest Week which ends today, will be concluded tonight with a group of radio programs and talks.

George H. Barnes last night was speaker at a Green Cross dinner given by the associated chambers of commerce of San Bernardino and Riverside counties at San Bernardino. At noon yesterday the Green Cross official delivered an address on reforestation at the meeting of the Pasadena Lions' Club in the Hotel Maryland. John A.
