To qualify as a Timber Farmer the asso-ciation requires that: 1. The owner must effectively protect his property from forest fires. This may be ac-complished by cooperating in the forest fire control program conducted by the Division of Forestry of the North Carolina Depart-ment of Conservation and Development in localities where state protection is available localities where state protection is available, or through his own efforts where organized protection is not available.

2. The landowner must follow approved forestry practices with the view to assuring continuous production of commercial forest crops.
