Dear Mr. Neetzel:

I am glad to inform you that at a staff meeting of the Division of Forestry held on March 4th, you were unanimously elected to a Technical Assistantship in Forestry. It is important that I be informed at the earliest convenient date as to whether or not you will accept the appointment.

In making your decision you should keep in mind that the stipend is \$60.00 a month for an average of 90 hours of work in the California Forest Experiment Station. All of the work is done in the field of research and the hours of service are cumulative, that is, one can put in full time during holiday periods if desired. You should arrange to arrive in Berkeley about August 10th and should plan to remain here approximately 10 months.

When it is known that you will accept this position, you may expect to hear from the professor with whom you will do your major research work.
