Hippocastanaceae

Aesculus hippocastanum - Horse chestnut  
 Spiny. Buckeye without spines.  
 The soft maples have sharp serrures, the hard ones rounded.

Acer saccharinum wieri - Cut leaved maple

Acer platanoides - Norway M.  
 Leaves 3-5 lobed, green beneath. Milky juice, characteristic. Bark close, tight

Acer saccharum - Sugar Maple  
 Oaks below

Acer saccharinum - Silver Maple  
 Leaves deeply & sharply cleft, glaucous
